





















































THE CURRICULUM

- Students are advised to keep their classroom, buses, School building and campus spic and span.
- All students must speak in English in the School premises.
- Students should not wear expensive watches, or jewellery to School. No student is allowed to bring mobile phones or any form of electronic gadgets.
- Parents must make it a point to check and sign the ephemeris, notebooks, report cards, notices etc; which the teachers may send for their perusal.
- Students who commute in the care of escorts, should never leave the School before the escorts arrive. In case of delay, students should contact the School office.
- Any loss or damage to the School property caused by the student must be made good by their parents / guardians.
- Please avoid repeated absence of your ward without valid reason as it creates gaps in the learning process.

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

- One clear calendar month's notice, in writing, or a month's fee in lieu of such notice must be given before a student can be withdrawn.
- A complete withdrawal form should be submitted to the School office.
- Transfer Certificate is not issued until all dues of the School are cleared.

DISMISSAL POLICY

A student can be asked to leave the School on the following grounds:

- Constant failure of payment of the fee before the due date.
- Absence from the School for no reason or for unacceptable reason for 20 consecutive days or 25 non consecutive days within a span of few months.

FEE SCHEDULE

- All fees are payable in advance by the 10th of the starting month of every quarter.
- April to June: to be paid by 10th of April (1st Quarter), July to September: to be paid by 10th of July (2nd Quarter), October to December: to be paid by 10th of October (3rd Quarter), January to March: to be paid by 10th of January (4th Quarter).
- Fee payable to the DN Foundation for Excellence.
- If the fee is not paid as per the schedule mentioned above, a fine of Rs.100/- (Rupees One Hundred Only) will be charged up to the date of deposit of fees at the School counter.
- In case the cheque is dishonoured, a service charge of Rs. 200/- will be charged along with the fee.
- If the fees are not deposited within 30 days from the stipulated date, the name of the student will be struck off from the roll.
- The bus fee is to be paid along with the School quarterly fee.

REFUND

Fee once paid is non-refundable.

BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION

- Students may wear casual/party dress on their birthdays.
- Parents will not be allowed to attend birthday celebrations in the Grade.

SCHOOL INFIRMARY

The School Infirmary is managed by a qualified nurse and a visiting doctor. Medical check-up of students is done and record is mentioned. If the Child is ill, Parents are requested not to send him / her to School.

MEDICAL ADVICE TO PARENTS / GUARDIANS

It is important to provide accurate and up-to-date record of your child especially if the child is suffering from chronic illness like Asthma, Epilepsy, Rheumatism, or any cardiac problem. The details of the illness must be filled up in the Ephemeris, with the treatment being taken and also if the child is under continuous medical supervision of a specialist doctor.

Impart health education to your child, follow a regular routine of hygiene like:

- Proper hair care as in preventing lice and getting rid of current lice infestation.
 Regular trimming of hair is must.
- Care of nails regular trimming of nails.
- Inculcate habit of washing of hands with soap and water before and after each meal.
- Brushing of teeth regularly, twice a day, followed by periodical visits to the dentist.
- De-worm your child at least once a year after consulting your doctor.
- Ensure that your child gets good sleep for about 7-8 hours, which is not only important for his/her physical development but also prevents him from feeling sleepy, lazy and sluggish during School hours.
- Make exercise a regular part of your child's daily routine, e.g. cycling and yoga.
- Ensure that he/ she drinks only boiled or filtered water.

DIET

Give your child nutritionally rich diet containing proteins, fats, carbohydrates, vitamins and minerals essential for proper growth and development. A good diet should contain all the ingredients like cereals, pulses, green leafy and other vegetables, milk and fruits with occasional changes.

FIRE DRILL

A fire drill is conducted on a regular basis to ensure speedy evacuation of all children in case of an emergency.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT

- 1. Parents are requested to ensure that children arrive at the pick-up point five minutes before the time allotted to them.
- 2. The guardian for the child should be fixed and identifiable by the child. The guardian must carry the parent card.
- 3. In case there is no guardian to pick up the child when the School bus reaches the stop, the child will be brought back to the School and the parents have to collect the child from the School on their own.
- 4. The transport fee is graded and will vary as per the distance.
- 5. The transportation fee has to be paid on a quarterly basis along with the School quarterly fee. Delay in payment of fee beyond the prescribed time will carry a fine. Parents need to give a terms notice to the School before discontinuation of School transportation.
- 6. The School has every right to reject request for extension/deviation of transport facility within the regular route followed.
- 7. The parent should inform the School office /Grade teacher (in writing or through phone) in advance if the child is not going to avail the School transport on a particular day to avoid last minute confusion.
- 8. The decision of the School in any matters whatsoever shall prevail.
- 9. Students should refrain from inflicting any damage to the School Bus like tearing seats etc.
- 10. No unauthorized person shall be allowed to travel in the School Bus.
- 11. Transport facility is available on a first-come first-serve basis.



Be yourself. Especially do not feign affection. Neither be cynical about love; for in the face of all aridity and disenchantment, it is as perennial as the grass.


Take kindly the counsel of the years, gracefully surrendering the things of youth.


